WALTER GRUBMÜLLER JR.



Walter Grubmüller started his racing driver career in go-kart racing in 2000 season when he was eleven years old. In 2005 he changed to open-wheel cars and participated in Formula Renault series (2005 – 2006) and Asian Formula 3 series (2006 – 2007). In his second year in Asian Formula 3 he finished ninth overall with Aran Racing team.

In 2007 season Walter Grubmüller entered British F3 International championship, the leading single seater Championship in the UK, and one of the world's leading Formula 3 category, considered as traditional training ground for stars of the future. Actually several F1 champions won British F3 in their career beginnings: Jackie Stewart in 1964, Emerson Fittipaldi in 1969, Nelson Piquet in 1978, Ayrton Senna in 1983 and Mika Häkkinen in 1990. Walter Grubmüller achieved four top ten places and seven points in his debut year in British F3. After 22 races he finished 16th overall.

For 2008 season Walter Grubmüller stayed in British F3 International championship. The most remarkable results of the season were two fourth places achieved in races at Oulton Park and Monza. Grubmüller finished 13th overall.

His third season in British F3 International championship has been the most successful one for twenty-years old Austrian Walter Grubmüller. In 2009 season he achieved two wins (Hockenheim and Donington) and seven further podium places with Austrian-based HiTech Racing Team, owned by Walter Grubmüller sen. Thanks to these results Walter Grubmüller finished second in the overall rankings of British F3.

In 2010 season a programme in World Series by Renault 3.5 is prepared for Walter Grubmüller. He is going to enter the series under the guise of British P1 Motorsport team, which earned the series' s title in 2008 season with its Dutch driver Giedo van der Garde.
